Subject: Nominations for Excellence in Teaching Awards

The annual UH Mānoa Excellence in Teaching Awards highlight the importance of quality teaching at the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa. The Office of Faculty Development and Academic Support (OFDAS) administers this process.

#### **TIMELINE**

- 1. OFDAS facilitates the online nomination process. Any student, faculty member, staff, administrator, or alumnus may nominate a faculty member **from September 20 through October 18, 2024** at www.ofdas.hawaii.edu.
- 2. OFDAS compiles nominations and sends lists to each college/school liaison by October 23, 2024.
- 3. The College/School Deans will appoint a committee to select their finalists and submit their e-dossiers to OFDAS by **January 9, 2025**.
- 4. The campus-wide Mānoa Awards Committee will review the college/school finalists' dossiers and submit recommendations to the President by mid-late March.
- 5. Award recipients will be announced in April or May 2025.

# College/School Procedures For Screening And Selecting Finalists

The Dean will establish an awards committee to screen nominees and select its finalists. The Committee Chair should be an associate dean or appropriate senior faculty member. The Committee may choose to develop additional college procedures and internal deadlines for application material review.

#### The Committee shall ensure that:

- Each nomination falls under their College/School. If it is discovered that a nominee does not fall under their College/School, immediately email OFDAS at ofdas@hawaii.edu so that the nomination(s) may be reassigned.
- The College/School does not exceed its quota.
- Each finalist has included <u>summaries</u> of six semesters of student evaluations (sample form is attached if needed). Maximum of three student comments per class. Raw data should not be included and will not be considered.
- Each finalist has included the required number of letters of support (minimum of five, maximum of eight). Additional letters should not be included and will not be considered.
- The college/school is encouraged to advise candidates to include only pertinent information and materials that demonstrate creative and innovative teaching in the dossier. An excessive amount of documentation may hinder a thorough and complete review, rather than enhance the presentation and review process and will not increase one's chances of a positive outcome.

The Committee must forward the finalists' dossiers to OFDAS by **3:00 p.m., Friday, January 9, 2025**:

## **eDOSSIER REQUIREMENTS FOR FINALISTS**

A single eDossier PDF for each finalist should be organized in separate sections to include:

- A **statement** of a philosophy of teaching, maximum of three pages
- Information on courses taught with number of students and six semesters of student course evaluation **summaries** (a sample form is attached if needed). Maximum of three student comments per class. **Do not submit raw data**.
- Curriculum vitae
- Supporting materials demonstrating creative and innovative teaching with only pertinent content to avoid an excessive amount of documentation.
- Letters of support from people with different perspectives (student, colleague, department chair, etc.): minimum of five letters, maximum of eight letters

# Board of Regents (BOR) Medal for Excellence in Teaching Presidential Citation for Meritorious Teaching

#### **ELIGIBILITY**

- Full-time UH Mānoa faculty members with instructional duties and an established record of accomplished teaching for the last three years at UH
- EWC or Research Institute joint appointees with at least 50% teaching loads during the previous three years up to and including the current Fall semester
- Faculty who do not meet the strict eligibility criteria (e.g. Specialist Faculty teaching duties) may include a letter of explanation from the Dean and will be considered on an ad hoc basis by the Mānoa Awards Committee.
- The Board of Regents (BOR) award is only awarded <u>once</u> in a lifetime. Previous BOR award recipients are not eligible for a second BOR nomination or award, but could be eligible for a Presidential Citation.

#### **CRITERIA**

- Subject Mastery and Scholarship The teacher demonstrates mastery of the subject matter in courses taught, has the ability to organize, emphasize and clarify ideas, elicit useful questions, communicate knowledge beyond the mere exchange of information. The teacher blends new ideas, research and developments into classroom instruction.
- Teaching Effectiveness and Creativity The teacher has developed effective skills in managing the art and craft of teaching; well-prepared for class, interesting and clear presentations, fair and reasonable evaluation of students, ability to encourage and motivate learning in students. The teacher is open to new techniques and approaches to stimulate learning, and demonstrates these qualities in innovative ways.
- Personal Values Beneficial to Students The teacher has an interest in student learning
  and the quality of the learning environment, is enthusiastic about teaching,
  approachable, tolerant of different viewpoints, and sensitive to cultural, ethnic and
  gender differences among students. The teacher treats students with respect and
  promotes civility and good relationships among students.

## Frances Davis Award for Excellence in Undergraduate Teaching

(Revised 09/14/2023 by UH Foundation)

The Frances Davis Award, financed largely by faculty contributions, is a memorial to the late Frances Davis who taught mathematics at Leeward Community College and University of Hawai'i at Mānoa for 19 years. Frances Davis was an inspired teacher dedicated to sharing her knowledge of mathematics with undergraduates attending the University of Hawai'i ("UH"). The award recognizes recipients for their dedication to teaching, for their demonstrated excellence as teachers, and for their attention to undergraduate students.

#### **ELIGIBILITY**

- Candidates must be full-time or part-time faculty or lecturers in good standing at any UH campus. Graduate assistants at UH Mānoa are also eligible to receive this award. Nominations of graduate assistants will be handled separately by UH Mānoa's Graduate Division.
- Candidates should demonstrate a record of dedication to teaching, excellence in the design and instruction of lower division or interdisciplinary undergraduate courses, and service to undergraduate students.

#### WEIGHING PRIORITIES

**HIGHEST:** Demonstrated professional expertise as exhibited in teaching success.

2<sup>ND</sup> HIGHEST: Demonstrated interest and involvement on behalf of students.

**3<sup>RD</sup> HIGHEST:** Demonstrated exemplary performance, setting a good example for students.

## September 20, 2024 Online Nomination Process Begins

Email memo to College Deans, Liaisons, Assistants/ Secretaries, and Department Chairs. Post to UH Calendar of Events and submit for campuswide announcement via Announce@UH.

## October 18, 2024 Deadline to Submit Online Nominations

OFDAS compiles nominations and sends lists to each college/school liaison by October 24<sup>th</sup>.

## October 23, 2024 College/School Review Nominations & Select Finalists - Dossier Preparation

to January 9, 2025

Committees ensure strict adherence to dossier requirements.

## January 9, 2025 Deadline for College/School to UH filedrop finalist dossiers to OFDAS

at 3 p.m. College/Schools may not exceed their assigned quota.

## January 15 to

## February 25, 2025 Mānoa Awards Committee Reading, Review and Evaluation

OFDAS circulates 6-7 dossiers weekly to committee members during the

5-6 week reading cycle.

## March 3-14, 2025 Awards Committee meets to discuss and finalize award recommendations

OFDAS submits recommendations and letters for final approvals.

## March 24 to

### April 4, 2025 Approvals and finalization of award letters

President approves congratulatory letters to finalists. Letters are sent out to the finalists with instructions for award recipients to contact OFDAS and confirm their acceptance of the awards. OFDAS processes awards and BOR medals through UHM, UHF, and the UH system and prepares awardee

biographies for announcements.
